BRIEF HISTORY OF FOUNDATION FOR CHILDREN IN NEED:

Foundation for Children in Need (FCN) was founded by Dr. Geetha Yeruva and Thomas Reddy Chitta in 2005 at Porumamilla in Kadapa (Dist), Andhra Pradesh, and have an office at Sanathnagar, Hyderabad. It's a non-profit organization that provides help to the needy children, college students and elderly in the rural villages. Dr. Geetha provides free medical care and health education to rural villagers and school children. FCN has helped to establish several schools, orphanages, a home for the aged, a tailoring and embroidery training center and a community health center. Currently FCN is building FCN Seva Ashram near Hyderabad Apart from these FCN actively takes part during natural calamities like Tsunami, floods etc. FCN is sponsoring 2500 orphans, physically challenged and needy children and college students in 24 locations.

Dr. Geetha and Thomas are very much interested in reaching out to the most needy in the remote villages. The approach is direct and the benefits are very concrete. They have dedicated their entire life to serve the poor. FCN has staff who personally supervise all the projects.



FREE CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE SURGERIES COORDINATED BY FCN THROUGH G.S.R. HOSPITAL, HYDERABAD:

Spreading miles of smiles to children living with abnormal facial condition. In India annually more than 30,000 children are born with Cleft Lip defects. These defects are equally a social and economic issue as it is a medical issue. Most of the cases are more rampant in the rural areas where the majority of the patients are poor, illiterate and where the access to medical treatment is scarce. Many children with Cleft Lip defects, especially girls, are either killed or abandoned, and some of them are taunted, ridiculed and alienated by their families and the society at a large.

With an aim of giving a better life, equal opportunities and to bringback smiles on the faces of these children with defects as well as happiness to their parents, Dr. Geetha and Thomas Reddy Chitta of the Foundation for Children in Need (FCN) have taken up an initiative and organized free Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate Surgeries in collaboration with the GSR Hospital, Hyderabad. FCN is helping 20 to 30 children every month.

CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE:

Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate are facial and oral malformations where there is a physical split or separation of the two sides of the upper lip. This condition develops very early, while the child is developing in the mother's womb. This results in child having eating problems, ear infections/hearing loss, speech disorders and dental problems besides having a dis-figured face.



FREE CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE SURGERIES COORDINATED BY FON THROUGH SANTHIRAM HOSPITAL, NANDYAL AND SMILE NETWORK INTERNATIONAL:

We are very pleased to share that our efforts to help the children born with Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate with corrective surgeries has won the admiration of one and all. We have helped 58 children in February 2015, 68 in Feb 2016 and 72 in Feb 2017 through Smile Network International medical team from USA and Santhiram Hospital, Nandyal. From Feb 4 to 9, 2018 we had another successful surgery Camp at Nandyal. 55 children and adults have benefited through these life changing surgeries.

The Smile Network international medical team of 26 from USA gave their time and talent to perform the surgeries and provided medicines.

Santhiram Hospital, Nandyal provided operating rooms, hospital beds for all those who underwent surgeries. They also provided food and accommodation to the parents.

TRAINING IN TAILORING AND EMBROIDERY



Women in India are the most affected when it comes to unemployment and poverty. Without income of their own they need to depend on men for monetary needs and other financing agencies which charge high interest rates.

FCN works for the women empowerment and prepares women for self employment. The focus is on poor women and widows from the rural villages. After completion of the Training in Tailoring and Embroidery women can start up a tailoring centre

or take up a job. FCN trains women in FCN Tailoring Training centre situated at FCN Head Office in Porumamilla, Kadapa district, A.P. They are also imparted training at other FCN's projects with the financial support from FCN. 20 Women received training during this financial year and sewing machines were freely distributed after the training. This is a 9 month course and a certificate is issued after the completion of the training. This Foundation strives for economical independence of women to stand on their feet.


